ORDER

The Magistrate Judges of this Court are hereby authorized in criminal cases to sign standard substitution of custody orders. To qualify as a standard substitution of custody order, an order must conform to the following specifications:

- 1). The United States Marshals Service (USMS) shall be directed to bring the prisoner to the United States Courthouse in Atlanta or Newnan;
 - 2). The substitution of custody shall occur only at the specified United Stated Courthouse in Atlanta or Newnan;
 - 3). The names of the agents who will take custody of the prisoner from the USMS shall be listed;
 - 4). In moving the prisoner to and from the USMS cellblock, the prisoner shall be handcuffed;
 - 5). In the United States Courthouse in Atlanta, the agents shall use the large freight elevator or the prisoner elevator in moving the prisoner to and from the USMS cellblock;
 - 6). The Prisoner shall not be taken out of the United States Courthouse;
- and,

7). The prisoner shall be returned to the custody of the USMS no later than 3:00 p.m., on the same day.

Any substitution of custody of order not conforming with the above specifications shall be submitted to the District Judge assigned to the criminal case or to the Duty District Judge if no District Judge has yet been assigned to the case.

The conditions under which magistrate judges are authorized to sign custody orders in the Rome and Gainesville Divisions shall be determined by the respective district judge for that division.
