ORDER

This matter comes before the Court as a result of changes to the Court's Case Management, Electronic Case Filing System (CM/ECF) and pursuant to the request of the United States Attorney that, in recognition of those changes, the Court enter a standing order dismissing all counts as to a particular defendant still pending when a Judgment and Commitment Order is entered in a criminal case as to that defendant, unless the United States Attorney specifically moves the Court for a different disposition of any such counts.


The Clerk has advised the Court that proper operation of the Court's Case Management and Electronic Case Filing System now requires that all pending counts be disposed of before a case is closed in the system. The Clerk further advises that previous efforts to address this issue on a case by case basis have not succeeded and Judgment and Commitment Orders continue to be entered with outstanding counts still pending.

In light of the above, and to ensure both the proper disposition of all counts upon entry of the Judgment and Commitment Order and the continued integrity of the Court's Case Management System, it is hereby ORDERED, ADJUDGED, and DECREED:

That any counts still pending in a criminal case at the time the Judgment and

Commitment Order is entered are dismissed without prejudice, absent other Order of the sentencing Court in response to a motion of the United States Attorney in the case.
